NSF INTERN Overview

What is INTERN?

INTERN (Non-Academic Research Internships for Graduate Students) is a supplemental funding opportunity for graduate students who are supported by certain NSF funding programs.

For detailed information, view the Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) NSF DCL 21-013.

Who is eligible? Current GRFP Fellows interested in <u>non-academic</u> internships. To be eligible, graduate students must have completed at least one academic year in their graduate programs (master's or doctoral) and be making satisfactory progress towards the completion of their degrees. Fellows can be either On Tenure or On Reserve.

What is a non-academic internship?

There are many possibilities mentioned in Dear Colleagues Letter (DCL). Things to consider:

- Includes national labs, government agencies (NOAA, NPS, NSF, NIH, DOD, DOE), companies, non-profit organizations.
- <u>Does not include</u> labs at other universities OR most centers, institutes, or labs located on the campuses of universities and staffed by faculty from a university.
- May be international.
- Up to 6 months in length.

How can I determine whether an internship might be suitable for funding?

The PI for the active GRFP award at your institution should contact the program via email at GRFPINTERN@nsf.gov to help determine if an internship might be within the scope of what would be considered for funding by GRFP.



Applying to INTERN

How do I submit a request? Fellows should contact their CO for assistance with submitting an INTERN Supplement request. The CO will contact the GRFP PI who will submit the request on your behalf. Fellows are not the PI and cannot submit supplemental funding requests.

If there are additional questions after the Fellow and CO consult, the CO or PI may contact GRFPINTERN@NSF.gov.

How far in advance do I apply?

We ask for 7 months between time of initial submission and start of internship. This allows for compliance check, revisions, review, processing (if award is recommended), and official notice before start.

Is there a deadline?

The Dear Colleagues Letter specifies Supplemental funding requests may be submitted at any time during the year but should be submitted no later than April 15th to be eligible for consideration in the current Fiscal Year.

For PIs who are submitting an INTERN supplement ONLY:

Go to Research.gov, under Awards & Reporting, to submit the INTERN supplemental funding request.

Funding Request Requirements

Please refer to the Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) for the detailed explanation of request requirements:

- Description of internship and resume (two-pages max)
- Letter from host organization confirming offer of internship AND from GRFP PI in support of internship
- Institutional Review Boards (IRB) determination (REQUIRED OF ALL!)
- Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) protocol, if applicable
- An intellectual property agreement signed by officials from host organization and university (Fellow not authorized to sign for university)
- Budget and justification

First and foremost, please read the Dear Colleague Letter (DCL)!



INTERN Budget – Allowable Costs

For fellows On Reserve, the budget can include stipend at GRFP level (\$3083/month), tuition, and required fees. Fellows On Tenure are not eligible to receive stipend.

Allowable costs

- Relocation costs (travel, lodging during internship)
 - Justification must include basis for cost estimates for flights or other travel, lodging
- Travel for thesis advisor (up to \$2500)
- Materials and supplies (up to \$2500)
 - Must include details including cost, amounts, etc.
- ❖ Indirect costs

Unallowable costs

- ❖ Food, phone, internet, or other items that would be considered living expenses
- Travel to conferences
- Publication costs

Total budget including indirect costs may not exceed \$55,000.

GRFP and External Activities

Fellows are permitted to pursue professional development opportunities, such as internships and traineeships. Fellows are required to check with their IHE about specific policies pertaining to the GRFP Fellowship and paid activities.

GRFP Fellowships cannot be concurrently accepted or combined with support from another *individual* federal graduate fellowship regardless of Fellow's status.

	Federally funded	Non-federally funded
Awarded to individual		
Internship/Traineeship	Permitted w/ approval from Institution: Ex: DOE Office of Science Graduate Student Research (SCGSR)	Permitted w/ approval from Institution Ex: Apple Intern
Assistantship	Permitted w/ approval from Institution Ex: NIJ Research Assistantship Program (RAP)	Permitted w/ approval from Institution Ex: University-funded Assistantships
Fellowship	Not permitted* Ex: NIH F31 or F32	Permitted w/ approval from Institution Ex: Ford Fellowship



Federally-Funded External Activities

What is permitted for federally-funded external activities?

Fellows may be permitted to accept assistantships/internships/traineeships, depending on how the awards are made. These awards are typically:

- 1) Awarded to and managed by the institution and the institution decides the recipients. *OR*
- 2) Awarded to the Research/Academic Advisor and the advisor manages how funding is utilized.

Ex: NIH T32, NSF Research Traineeship, NIH R01.

Fellows are not permitted to accept federally-funded fellowships, but can solicit/accept support for research expenses (such as laboratory supplies, travel expenses, conference/registration fees, etc.)

While On Reserve, Fellows may accept stipend support while on approved federally-funded internships/assistantships. Regardless of status, Fellows are not permitted to receive concurrent stipend support from two federal sources.

International External Activities

What about international opportunities unrelated to NSF INTERN?

Fellows may be permitted to pursue international activities, such as study abroad or research assistantships, with approval from their institution. The Fellow must remain enrolled fulltime at their home institution (as defined by their Registrar and supported by their transcript).

Fellowships/Assistantships that require students to enroll and/or pursue degrees at international universities, such as Fulbright, Churchill Scholarship, and Marshall Scholarship, are **not permitted** while under the GRFP Fellowship.
