
Vets disproportionally come from groups underrepresented in academia

- Technical education in a STEM-related field ex: Nuclear Power School, Electricians Mate school, Aircraft Mechanics school





"Student veterans/service members are less likely to participate in experiential learning opportunities, such as internships or practicums, leaning communities, study abroad, or community service"




Veteran/Service Member

outside of class





Full-Time First-Time Students























Student Veteran Career Resources
